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# Historic Environment Information

## Introduction

Within Guildford borough there are many important heritage assets, both designated and non-designated, that contribute to its character, sense of place, attractiveness and quality of life. These include significant buildings, monuments, sites, places, areas and landscapes that have a degree of heritage interest. These assets are invaluable and irreplaceable. They also impact on the economic well-being of the borough. This document pulls together the information we have on our heritage assets, but it is not exclusive; we appreciate that details can change over time.

## Designation

Designation is the term given to the practices of listing buildings, scheduling monuments, registering parks, gardens and battlefields and protecting wreck sites; these are called designated assets. Designation highlights in detail what is significant about an asset. It helps ensure that its character is protected through the planning system and any future changes to it do not result in the loss of its significance.

There are three types of designation: scheduling, registering and listing. The method of designation is determined by the type of asset concerned. All designated assets can be viewed on the [National Heritage List for England](http://historicengland.org.uk/listing/the-list) (<http://historicengland.org.uk/listing/the-list>).

We also have non-designated assets that are considered locally important. Whilst these are not assets of national importance their significance does carry some weight and needs to be considered through the planning process. More detail is provided in the relevant sections below.

## Listed buildings

A statutory Listed Building is a "building of special architectural or historic interest". The Secretary of State for the Department of Culture, Media and Sport (DCMS) is responsible for the compilation and maintenance of the Statutory List. Recommendations for, and records of, Listed Buildings are maintained by Historic England, which acts as the government's advisor on all additions and other alterations to the Statutory List. The list can be viewed online at the Historic England website: [www.list.historicengland.org.uk](http://www.list.historicengland.org.uk). You cannot alter or demolish a Listed Building without permission.

Guildford has over 1,000 buildings that are of special architectural or historic interest which are included in the Statutory List. Copies of the list for Guildford can be viewed at our Main Reception at Millmead House or listed properties can be individually viewed on our interactive map of planning information online at <http://www.guildford.gov.uk/planningmap>. There are also buildings in the Borough that are classified as Locally Listed Buildings (see section below).

The term Listed Building includes:

- both the interior and the exterior of a particular building
- any objects or structures fixed to the building and can include freestanding items such as walls, gates and other buildings within the defined curtilage of the listed building.

Listed buildings (unless the list entry indicates otherwise) includes not only the building itself but also:

- any object or structure fixed to the building
- any object or structure within the curtilage of the building which, although not fixed to the building, forms part of the land and has done so since before 1 July 1948

Buildings are classified in grades to show their relative importance as follows:

- Grade I - These are buildings of exceptional interest
- Grade II\* - These are particularly important buildings of more than special interest
- Grade II - These are buildings of special interest, which warrant every effort being made to preserve them.

## Locally listed buildings

In addition to the Statutory List that is compiled and maintained by the Department of Culture, Media and Sport (DCMS) we have a list of buildings of special local architectural or historic interest, these are non-designated heritage assets. This is known as the Local List, and currently includes over 200 buildings and structures including telephone boxes, post boxes and walls. The current Local List is attached as Appendix A but please note this is subject to change. Please contact Guildford Borough Councils Design and Conservation Team for the most accurate and up to date information.

Although a building does not have any more legal protection if it is on this Local List, the list helps us to remain in control of any changes to these buildings and to make sure that we don't lose the special interest of these properties. These non-designated heritage assets are a material consideration in the planning process.

## Conservation areas

A conservation area is an area that is designated because of its special architectural or historic interest, the character or appearance of which it is desirable to preserve or enhance. The borough has 40 Conservation Areas, which cover many parts of Guildford town centre and many of the villages in the rural area.

A Conservation Area usually has a combination of the following:

- buildings of high architectural quality
- an interesting and attractive layout
- an interesting or important social history

## Conservation Area Character Appraisal

The purpose of a Conservation Area Character Appraisal is to clearly identify what it is about the character and appearance of each area that should be conserved or enhanced and set out the means by which that objective is pursued. It is hoped that the clear assessment and definition of an area's special interest and the action needed to protect it will help to generate awareness and encourage local property owners to take the right sort of action for themselves.

The aim of a Conservation Area Character Appraisal is to:

- Improve the understanding of the history and historical context of the area
- Generate awareness of exactly what it is about the Conservation Area that makes it 'of special interest'
- Provide residents and owners with a clear idea of what should be cared for and preserved.
- Provide residents and owners with a clear idea of what enhancements could be made to the Conservation Area
- Provide a useful tool with which to guide future development, planning policies and practice for the area

As archaeology is usually buried and can be an unknown quantity large scale development sites should be routinely screened and checked as part of the planning process to cater for the possibility of important but hitherto unknown remains being present.

## Heritage at risk

Historic England keep a register of heritage at risk. A site must be nationally designated to be eligible for inclusion on the Register. The Register includes grade I and II\* listed buildings, grade II listed buildings in London, plus all listed places of worship, scheduled monuments, registered parks and gardens, registered battlefields and protected wreck sites assessed as being at risk. Conservation areas are also included on the register and these sites have been designated by local planning authorities.

### [Abinger Hammer, Shere - Guildford](#)

Abinger Hammer is identified as a Conservation area at risk. It is assessed as a Conservation Area in poor condition and deteriorating.

[Church of Holy Trinity, High Street, Guildford - Guildford](#) Town centre church, mainly built of brick in the mid-C18. There are areas of the church in poor condition including defective parapet gutters, cracked render to

the inner tower parapets, evidence of leaks internally in the north and south eastern corners to the aisles, slipped slates, open joints to the brick and stonework, and debris in the drainage channels and gullies. A successful application has been made to the Heritage Lottery Fund for grant aid which should allow the repair project to commence.

#### [Church of St Luke, Burpham Lane, Burpham - Guildford](#)

Small village church designed by Henry Woodyer in 1859. Built of Bargate stone with tiled roofs. At risk due to defective roof tiling and rainwater disposal. PCC has been encouraged to apply for funding for repairs.

#### [Church of St Paul, Poyle Road, Tongham - Guildford](#)

Church of 1865 by Ewan Christian. Apsed church with shingled fleche and decorative banded fishscale roof. Roof and rainwater goods now in need of repairs, along with some isolated stone repairs.

#### [St Mary's Church, Quarry Street, Guildford - Guildford](#)

Medieval town centre church. At risk due to decaying stonework including the tower and window surrounds. A first phase of grant-aided repairs has been completed to the north aisle roof but further phases of repair work are required.

[Clandon Park, West Clandon - Guildford](#) (This description was written prior to the fire at Clandon Park)  
Lancelot Brown designed Clandon's landscape park c1776-81. The house and garden are owned by the National Trust but the park is privately owned. Unsympathetic or uncoordinated park use, facilities and access currently affects the overall integrity of the design and the setting of the house. An office development within the park included a legal agreement for a joint conservation management plan but was never signed. Future expansion of Guildford could further affect the park and its setting. A joint working approach and a Conservation Management Plan would reverse the decline.

## Article 4 Directions

Article 4 Directions are a mechanism for tightening planning controls over changes that are likely to directly impact on public views - usually the front of the house facing the street.

Where an Article 4 Direction is in place additional controls apply to the following works fronting onto a highway or open space:

- The alteration, installation or replacement of doors and windows.
- Any alteration to a roof including roof coverings, rooflights and solar panels.
- Building a porch.
- Enlargement, improvement or alteration such as an extension, removal or changes to architectural features.
- The provision of a hard surface.
- The erection, construction, improvement or alteration (including demolition) of a fence, gate, wall or other means of enclosure.
- The installation, alteration or replacement of a satellite dish or antenna.
- Removing totally or partially walls, gates, fences or other means of enclosure.
- Exterior painting of previously unpainted surfaces or changes of external colour schemes, or covering walls by render or like finishes.

And the following whether or not it fronts a highway or open space:

- Removing or altering chimneys.

## Historic Landscapes

Historic landscapes and battlefields may be registered. The Register of Parks and Gardens was established under the 1983 National Heritage Act. The Battlefields Register was established in 1995. Both Registers are administered by [Historic England](#). These designations do not carry separate controls, but are material considerations in the planning process.

We have published a Landscape Character Assessment, which is an assessment of the borough's landscape to provide information about what makes it special and varied. Our Landscape Character Assessment (LCA) was adopted in January 2007. It provides a strategy on how change through built development and land management can be guided to protect, conserve and enhance our landscape character. It includes information on historic land use and settlement patterns and refers to information available in the Surrey County Council document the Historic Landscape Character Assessment of Surrey.

## National and Local List of Requirements

When applying for planning permission or listed building consent you must take into account the [GBC National and Local List of Requirements](#) (for planning applications). The national lists describe the statutory or core requirements that are necessary to ensure an application is valid. These lists are set nationally and cannot be altered by the local planning authority. The local lists comprise additional requirements selected by individual local authorities from generic lists suggested by the Government.

## Historic Environment Record

Surrey's [Historic Environment Record](#) (HER) is maintained by Surrey County Council and is a comprehensive database of archaeological sites, finds and historic monuments within the current administrative county.

The record includes information relating to all aspects of the historic environment including historic buildings and landscape features, standing monuments, excavations, and cropmarks. Details of excavations and archaeological surveys are added to the record together with environmental information. The archive currently contains around 15,500 records. There is also a record of local history and archaeology of certain places in Surrey. The articles are written by local people, groups and societies and provide an introduction to the local history of an area.

A shortened and selected version of the database is now available on-line through the [Exploring Surrey's Past](#) website. Please be aware the terms of use of the HER data mapping is classed as unsuitable for commercial or planning enquiries.

## Planning Policy Context

The [National Planning Policy Framework](#) sets out the overarching planning policy framework, supported by [Planning Practice Guidance](#). Relevant legislation is set out in the overarching [Town and Country Planning Act 1990](#), with specific protection for buildings and areas of special architectural or historic interest within the [Planning \(Listed Buildings and Conservation Areas\) Act 1990](#). The [Ancient Monuments and Archaeological Areas Act 1979](#) provides specific protection for scheduled monuments.

Any decisions relating to listed buildings and their settings and conservation areas must address the statutory considerations of the Planning (Listed Buildings and Conservation Areas) Act 1990 (see in particular sections 16, 66 and 72) as well as satisfying the relevant policies within the National Planning Policy Framework and the Local Plan.

The Guildford borough [Local Plan 2003](#) contains local plan policies that include specific policies on listed and locally listed buildings, conservation areas, scheduled ancient monuments and other sites and monuments of national importance and historic parks and gardens.

The emerging [Local Plan: strategy and sites](#) includes a strategic policy on Guildford boroughs historic environment. The second part of the Local Plan: Development Management Policies will include more detailed planning policies, including specific policies on listed and locally listed buildings, conservation areas, scheduled ancient monuments and other sites and monuments of national importance and historic parks and garden.

## Appendix A

### Locally Listed Buildings

We have a list of buildings of special local architectural or historic interest. This is known as the Local List, and currently includes over 200 buildings and structures including telephone boxes, post boxes and walls. This is in addition to the Statutory List, which is compiled and maintained by the Department of Culture, Media and Sport (DCMS).

Although a building does not have any more legal protection if it is on this Local List, the list helps us to remain in control of any changes to these buildings and to make sure that we do not lose the special interest of these properties. These non-designated heritage assets are a material consideration in the planning process and the National Planning Policy Framework (paragraph 135) states that:

“The effect of an application on the significance of a non-designated heritage asset should be taken into account in determining the application. In weighing applications that affect directly or indirectly non designated assets, a balanced judgement will be required having regard to the scale of any harm or loss and the significance of the heritage asset.”

Properties included in this Council's local list of Buildings of Special Architectural or Historic Interest but not included in the national statutory lists compiled by the DCMS are not registrable in Part 10 of the Local Land Charges Register. For a full description of the records, please refer to the Guildford Borough Council Design and Conservation Team.
